

**Regulation on Ukrainian refugees by the Ministry MKFFI NRW / District Government of Cologne.
(Status 17.03.2022)**

For Ukrainians with a contact address in the district of Euskirchen:

1. Registration at the responsible registration office (with confirmation from the landlord)
2. The application for a residence permit must be completed for each person. The application is usually handed over to the residents' registration office. The application can also be downloaded here. [Download](#)
The application must be submitted to the Aliens' Registration Office along with proof of identity from the country of origin (passport, identity card, birth certificate, marriage certificate) and the confirmation of registration. The contact address of the host/landlord must also be given. A biometric passport photo must also be attached to the application if the person concerned does not have a passport.

If it is not possible to leave the country after 90 days, you must contact the foreigners authority responsible for you in good time before the 90 days expire.
